From the May Meeting:

- Approved Worship & Music Team's Recommendation to cancel Monday night worship at Bethel on the weekends of the "All Ishpeming ELCA" 5th Sunday service are held.
- Council Highlights

Accessible Worship

One of the most important changes made in the reformation was making worship accessible to everyone; putting worship in the language of the people and the invention of the printing press that put scripture into the hands of the people. Access to worship is vitally important, after all Liturgy is "the work of the people."

Over the last couple of years, Bethel has worked to make our worship more accessible to everyone. We upgraded the sound system and wireless microphones so we have a clear, clean sound. Along with the sound system upgrade, we updated our connection to the radio station to an automated, digital signal so our radio listeners have the best possible experience. We are still working to get all the fine details tuned in. For those who still have difficulty hearing, we now have 6 Williams Sound hearing assist devices (with several styles of earphones) that are connected to the sound system. Connie makes several large print options of the bulletin available on the back table. Pastor Tim always has printed versions of his sermons. There's even a magnifier available on the back table.

Several of our regular lectors have told us that they aren't comfortable climbing the steps up into the pulpit any longer. We want everyone to be able to participate in worship in any way they would like. Since we have a beautiful, smaller lecture that is a memorial and survived the fire, we have opted to use that so our lectors can all feel comfortable and read during worship without worry of falling or climbing. The tradition of a large pulpit came about in the Middle Ages as a way to allow people to hear whomever was speaking. It was an adaptation for accessibility. You'll note that if you see photos or visit these old churches, there's often a wall behind the pulpit and a small overhang; this was to project the sound. With modern sound systems the large pulpit is no longer a necessity.

You may have noted that our bread for communion has changed. We have a number of parishioners who have gluten and wheat allergies. We want to give everyone who desires to commune the opportunity to receive Holy Communion, so we are using homemade gluten free communion bread. A special thank you to Kathy Balzarini who has been working with Pastor Tim to perfect the bread recipe. In the communion trays, you may have noted that in the center there is a ring of white grape juice for those who wish to commune without alcohol.

The choir pews have been swapped out for chairs to make our music area more flexible and accommodating for our bell choir or instrumentalists. It also creates more room for better wheelchair access on the far side in the front of the church.

These are just some of the ways we at Bethel are making worship accessible to everyone. If there are other ways that we can help make worship accessible, please let us know.


The council presidents and vice presidents of each of the four ELCA churches continue to meet monthly to discuss potential future plans for the four congregations.

Siblings in Christ, in 1997 the ELCA did some serious thinking about the practice of word and sacrament, which is what you have called me to lead you in as your pastor (in fancy words, a pastor is a minister of word and sacrament). In 1997, our ELCA came out with a document called The Use of the Means of Grace.

In that document, principle 9, we read: In fidelity to the readings appointed for the day, the preacher proclaims our need of God's grace and freely offers that grace, equipping the community for mission and service in daily life.

This principle tells us the core of preaching- helping us to see where our needs are and to know God's grace at work. In Lutheran language: law and gospel.

Principle 9 also states: While other persons may sometimes preach, the called pastor of a congregation has responsibility for this preaching.

I give you this background because as we welcome some lay people from Bethel to preach when I am away, I first want to assure you that those individuals are not alone. We have taken some time to talk about the core of preaching: our need and God's grace. And we will continue to meet to learn and grow together.

Some may say lay people are preaching when I am away in order to save some cost on having a substitute preacher, but it is much more than that.

Why lay preachers? First and foremost: THEY ARE A GIFT to you! You get to hear the voices of people who you have worshipped with, sometimes for decades or longer. Their testimony will enrich you as you hear stories that may have gone unspoken. It will be a voice that allows variety from my weekly voice as your pastor. Maybe you will even get to know the lay preacher better- and if you do, it will enrich and grow your fellowship and community. And, the struggle and challenge and study your lay preachers engage in will allow them to grow as people of faith. Bethel will truly be blessed by this venture.

Thank you in advance for supporting your lay preachers. As is always the case, as we move forward into a future that is always changing, I am happy to talk with any of you at any time about your feedback and thoughts. We are also working to empower teams to do ministry, so there will be times it is more appropriate for you to talk to them. Thank you for providing that feedback and thoughts to the appropriate people in ways that are constructive and caring, that our life together might be built up and strengthened.
