Shining with the Light of Christ in the Northern Great Lakes Synod

"So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, especially for those of the family of faith." ~ Galatians 6:9-10

Dear People of the Northern Great Lakes Synod,

I remember being reluctant to play "Monopoly" with my brothers. I had learned that the game quickly became a source of conflict, especially when my competitive siblings did not lose, or win, with grace. The game would often be fraught with tension and anxiety, and end with tears, yelling, and maybe even a punch or two thrown for good measure. Maybe it only happened once, but I learned to not play that game.

Despite the occasional violence and fighting over a board game, even as children we all know, without having the language to say so, that our relationship as a family was always the priority. We were not allowed to be angry for long. Often, whatever lingering ill will there was dissipated after a snack, a nap, or shifting to another game that was far more fun.

This priority of relationship over the power of disagreement has continued into our adult life. We do not agree on everything. We have differing views and perspectives...on money, parenting, what shows are worth watching, what sports teams to support, and most markedly of late – politics. While this grieves me, it does not threaten the love I have for my siblings. I know that whoever wins the presidential election, the occupant of the oval office will not stop me from loving my siblings and holding that relationship as a priority.

The same goes for my neighbors and friends. The relationship is the

priority, not any disagreement concerning our political opinions or affiliations.

Granted, the relationship can be strained by such disagreements. We can feel sad that people we know and love can have different convictions. When we feel strongly, there is a real challenge as to how to interact, converse, and continue the focus on the relationship and the common ground we do share. But when the relationship is the priority, the rest feels less important, even as it continues to be important. I am hopeful that the same can be true of our families of faith. It is worth noting that our congregations continue to be one of the few places in society that continues to hold and defend space to disagree, even as we are unified in our desire and our efforts to serve the work of Christ. Without taking a poll, I would guess that each and every one of our congregations reflect the general division of our nation into the separate groups of Republicans, Democrats, Independents, nonvoters, etc. And yet, we continue to gather and be in proximity to each other. As the body of Christ, we worship together, share coffee fellowship, partner in ministry, and get the work of Christ done. In our families of faith, we are reminded again and again how our relationship with a loving God shapes who we are and how we are with our siblings in Christ and community neighbors, even and especially with those with whom we disagree. This is no small thing.

As the election results become apparent, as there may be discord and even violence, as some may not win, or lose, with grace, I put my trust in the power of Christ to bind us together in love. Relationship is the priority. Let us work for the good of all...together, no matter how we have voted or who occupies the oval office. Let us not grow weary in doing what is right, following Jesus our Lord and Savior every step of the way.

Ish ELCA update

Thank you to all Bethel members who participated in the Congregational Conversation on October 27. Your input is providing guidance to us as we move forward with the Ish ELCA group.

As you are aware, the four ELCA churches continue to meet monthly to discuss options for increased joint ELCA ministry in Ishpeming. On that note, the church councils at each of the churches (Bethel, Bethany, Faith, Trinity) are voting this month on a proposal to engage a church consultant to evaluate our properties. The explanation of the consultant's work is stated here:

The goal of the church building consultation is to guide the leadership of the ELCA congregations in Ishpeming, MI in making educated decisions about the best use of their building assets for joint ministry. This will be done by looking at each building and grounds with a focus on the mission and vision of the potential partnership amongst the congregations.

Bethel's church council met on Tuesday, Nov. 12 and approved the expenditure for the consultation. The four churches (or whichever churches decide to participate) will share the expenses. We will keep you posted on this visit.

The Ish ELCA group is also proposing a joint Vacation Bible School to be held in June in Ishpeming and offered by staff of Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp. Bethel's Church Council approved this plan and approved our financial support (again, shared by the four ELCA congregations).

At the next Ish ELCA meeting on December 6 we plan to learn more from Pastor J. Mills (Bethany's new "bridge" pastor) about his ministry in ELCA churches in Texas.
